LINES FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Skiers:

It is a great honor for me to be elected president of the Wisconsin Water Ski Federation. I will do my best to help you, the skier, and our organization in the coming year. I will need your help and support, however, if we are going to make our organization even bigger and better than it is.

The Board of Directors' meetings are always open to each and every one of you. They are held once a month in Stevens Point at the Holiday Inn at 8:00 P.M. The meeting dates for the remainder of the year are as follows:

- February 17, 1979
- March 10, 1979 (Think Tank Weekend)
- April 7, 1979
- May 12, 1979

I hope that you will get a chance to attend at least one of these meetings to see what our organization does for you.

I have made a few changes this year in trying to move the Directors' meetings along, but still allowing everyone to have their say. First of all, we will be holding executive board dinner meetings at 6:00 p.m. The executive board consists of the president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, councilman, and one director. These meetings, I hope, will be to hash things out ahead of time so we will have a firm stand to present to the Directors. This should save timely discussions which always lead to repetition anyway. 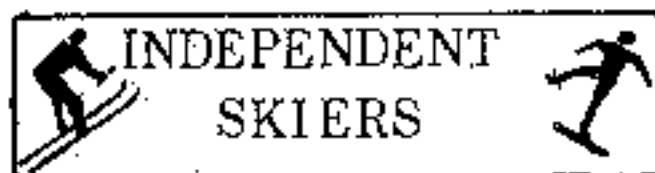

This is YOUR organization, so let us hear from you!!

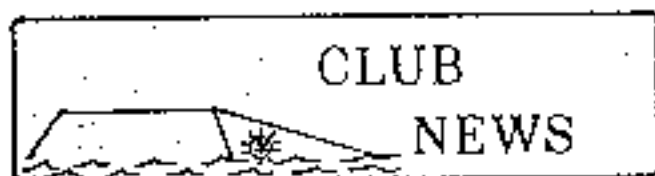

They captured first place at Lamb's Farm, second at State, and set a record by placing 1st in the National Show Tournament for the fourth straight year. Club members also took home most of the individual trophies: Dan Duren was the #1 boat driver, Chip Davenport the best show announcer, Dan Decker tops in

dock personnel, and Bruce Sakrison, pick-up boat driver, tied for second.

As National Show Champions, Capital City was invited to perform at the National Three Event Tournament. They traveled to Tivoli Gardens, Michigan, for an excellent show on Aug. 25. Everyone enjoyed meeting new friends looking at the exhibits and displays, and watching the tournament on Friday and Saturday. A special thanks to all those who made the trip possible.

President Joe Lincicum headed the club in 1978. Other officers included Vice-President Dan Decker, Sec.-Treas. Debbie Davenport, & Show Director Chip Davenport. The Aquanuts began their weekly Saturday night show schedule in Twin Lakes on May 27 and ended on Sept. 2. They successfully defended their title as State Show Champions at Wis. Rapids in July, and placed 2nd at Lamb's Farm and the National Show Tournament.

The club had as their goal this summer repayment of a loan for their new Hydrodyne tow boat. To achieve that, they had a benefit spaghetti dinner in May, sold bumper stickers and ads for a program distributed at shows, and also did two road shows.

Ever wonder why we call ourselves the "Minneiska Ski Team?" Since we come from Whitewater, Wis. and are sponsored by the Whitewater Lake Sports Club, we chose the Indian name "Minneiska", which means white water.

MIN-AQUA BATS

Did you know that the Min-Aqua Bats is the oldest water ski club in the United States? The club originated in 1950 with a group of local young people skiing together on Sunday afternoons. After a short time, the skiers noticed people would stop along the road to watch. A few of the skiers got the idea to put together a show, and the Min-Aqua Bats Water Ski Club was born!

By 1952, the club had drafted a charter, completed a handmade jump, and were performing shows regularly. As a non-profit organization, the members choose to "pass the bat" at each performance to provide needed equipment for the skiers' safety and to enhance the acts for the greater enjoyment of the audience. In 1954, the club bought their first boat: a red, white, and blue Correct Craft they called their "dream boat." Lighting and a clubhouse were added in 1956.

The Min-Aqua Bats have come a long way since 1950. They now have a new clubhouse, a public address system, a new fiberglass jump, two Hydrodyne boats and a safety boat.

Skiing, of course, was not forgotten. Between the middle 50's and early 60's the club perfected many of the acts which are in the show today; they originated the trio and doubles acts currently used in most shows. Most of the acts were developed through a trial and error method.

In 1962, the Min-Aqua Bats were the force behind the establishment of the Wisconsin Water Ski Federation: the "voice of Wisconsin water skiers."

The club has also been extremely active in tournaments, both as originator and host. Their own tournament, the Lakeland Jumping Tournament, was started in 1953, and has since been expanded into the Badger Open Water Ski Tournament. The club has hosted several major tournaments. In 1952, Minocqua was the site of the National Water Ski Tournament. In 1952, '53, '54, '57, '64, and '67, the Midwest Regionals took place at the Aqua Bowl. The Min-Aqua Bats have also won their share of championships.

Three years ago, the Min-Aqua Bats sponsored an All-Star Benefit Water Ski Show and

SHOW SKIERS CAPTURE NATIONAL ATTENTION

The Capital City Ski Team, from Madison, Wis., was honored with an invitation from the National 3-Event Tournament Committee to present their championship show during the Nationals at Tivoli Gardens, Mich. on Aug 25.

After their 7 p.m. show on Thurs., Aug. 24, it took the 37 club members 2 hours to get their equipment ready for travel. Departing at midnight, they were on the road only 40 minutes when a fire put the air conditioner out of order. The eight hour bus trip was completed without air conditioning; unfortunately it was also the hottest weekend of the summer. No one got any sleep; card games, stories, song fests, and refreshments helped pass the time.

At Ann Arbor, the skiers were guests for the weekend at the home of Mr. & Mrs. Dave Lake. The Lakes were gracious hosts, as were all the people involved in arranging the trip and show.

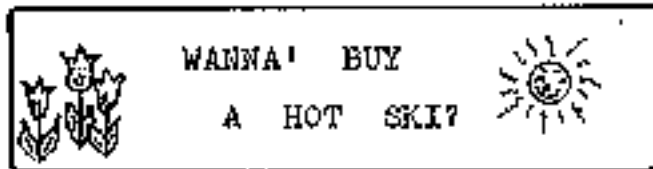
After freshening up at the Lakes' home, the skiers set out for Tivoli Gardens. Their excellent bus driver, Spencer, solved the problem of how to make a grand entrance by proceeding to get stuck in the sand. (This got the attention of tourney officials!) The bus was pulled out and unloaded, and the day was spent watching the tournament.

The weather was hot and humid--ideal for skiing. The crowd was great; due to Roger Kring, and others who built up the show throughout the tournament, no one left the site. The AMBA National Committee postponed their meeting to watch the 7p.m. show. They were not disappointed as Capital City put on the show that won the Nationals, including their seven-host intro.

A dance at the site followed the show; the club returned to the Lakes' for a relaxing evening. They spent Sat. at the site, and boarded the bus (with a new air conditioner) that night for the return trip. Tho they did not arrive until 5 a.m. Sunday, the show went on as usual Sunday night.

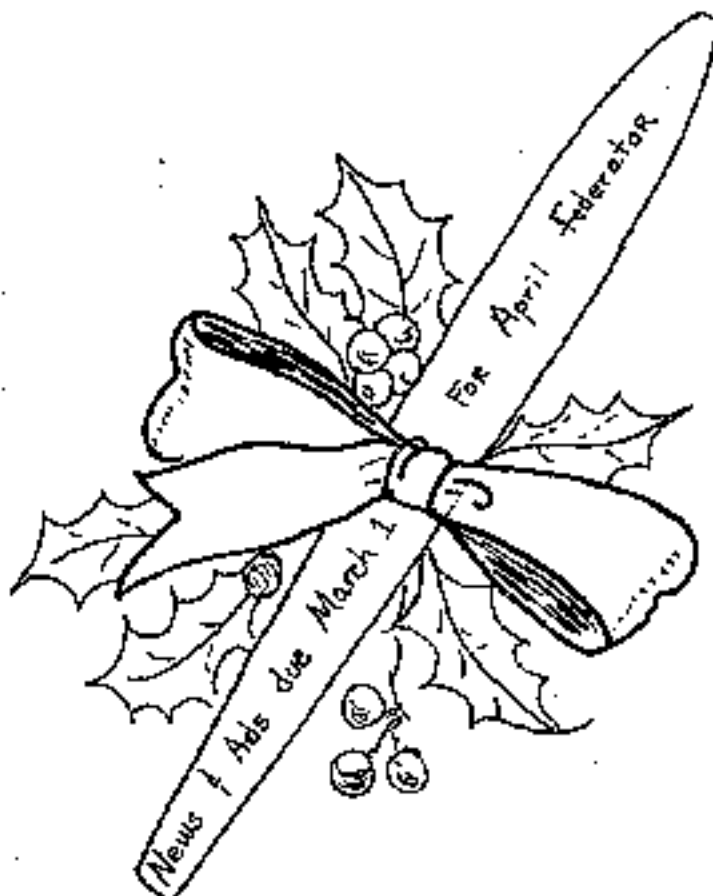
This show by Capital City was part of a

continuing effort to focus more attention on show skiing. The national committee is considering proposals to have the National Show and 3-Event tournaments at the same site and time in order to promote all phases of water skiing. FOOTNOTES

Forty-one of the nation's top barefooters traveled to Waco, Texas over the Labor Day weekend to compete in the first AWSA National Barefoot Championships. A great time was had by all in what is sure to become an annual event. Correct Craft used the occasion to unveil its new Barefoot Nautique which is bigger and more powerful than the standard Ski Nautique and has a number of performance characteristics of interest to barefooters.

The big story was Sea World's Mike Botti, who won three Men I events by considerable margins, but did not compete in jumping, making him ineligible for overall. A new US jump record of 45' was set by Bill Farrell. Jordy Jackson, who comes off the ramp like a human cannonball, feet first, had a metered FALL in the 60's!

Wisconsin footers did an outstanding job, capturing firsts overall in 3 out of 7 divisions! Five others posted great performances to finish high. They are:

Men I Randy Miter (WaterBugs) put in solid performances in all four events to win overall. In 8th place was Mark Thompson (Chetek). Mike Seipal (WaterBugs) and Brad Christiansen (Nagawatics) scored high in starts, wakes, & tricks, but did not compete in jumping.

Junior Boys James Matthisen (Nagawatics) scored a superior win in starts (350 pts) to place 2nd overall. Britt Crister (Chetek) was 5th overall.

Women Jean Matthisen (Nagawatics) scored a clear sweep with decisive victories in all 3 events---550 points to 180 for her closest competitor.

Junior Girls Debbie Harvey (Shermalot) bested the field with wins in starts & slalom.

The championships served as a 'team trials' to select the US Barefoot Team that competed in the First World Barefoot Water Ski Championships in Australia in November. Watch for those results in the April Federator!
