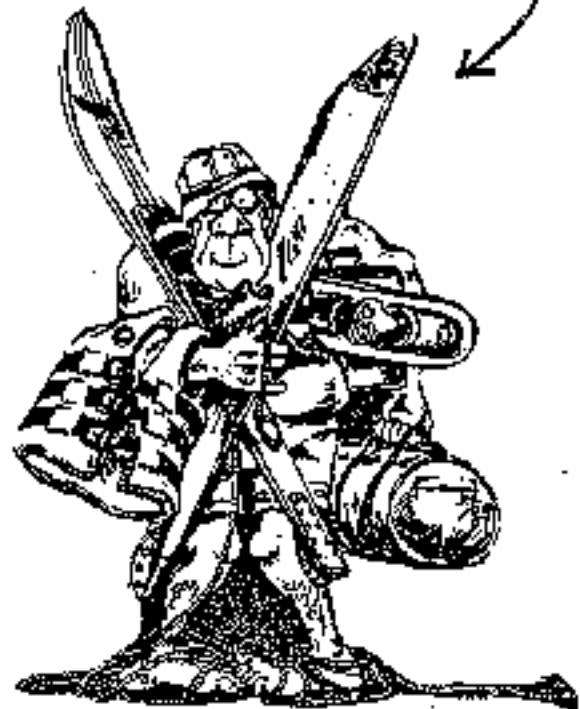

Election of WWSF Officers

1. Election of officers for the 1981-1982 season will be held on Sat. July 18, 1981 at the Wis. State Show Tourn. in Wis. Rapids.
2. Printed ballots will be used.
3. The nominating committee will choose one person per office whom they feel is the best qualified for each job.
4. Other nominations can be submitted by written notice to the nominating committee chairman, Margo Oppenheim, by June 27, 1981. No nominations will be taken from the floor at the meeting as in previous years.
5. Any persons running for the office of treasurer must submit written verification of bondability to the nominating committee chairman by June 27, 1981.
6. Ballots will be printed at that time and will be available for proxy votes.
7. If you wish to vote by proxy ballot you must send a self addressed - stamped envelope with the request for the ballot to the nominating committee chairman by June 27, 1981.
8. Proxy ballots must be returned to the nominating committee chairman after voting by July 15, 1981. If you wish to vote by secret ballot please put your ballot inside another envelope and seal it.
9. Proof of AWSA membership must accompany proxy votes for AWSA councilperson. WWSF membership will be verified with the membership committee.
10. On election day proof of AWSA membership (Water Skier/label, wallet card or copy of mailing lable) will be required to vote for the AWSA councilperson. WWSF membership will be checked by the membership committee of the site.
11. Officers for election are: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Director at Large(2) and AWSA Councilperson.

4. Profiler of Inherent:
 1. Skiers skiing in a 3 event tournament must ski in their own division and will not be allowed to ski for rating only. If you rise your turn on the running order you will no longer be allowed to ski at the end of the event for rating only.
 2. I want skiers to ski in only one event tournament. The entry/withdrawal fee for the Midwest Regional Guide is \$60.00 for a two day tournament (full page) and \$20.00 for a one day tournament (half page) effective immediately.
 3. Congratulations to Helen Greene on becoming a Regular Secretary
 4. State changes:
 - a. Rule 2.05 (for their representatives)
 - b. Majority of the appointed judges must approve the change and all affected contestants, or their representatives, shall be notified.
 - c. It is not necessary to time the jump area if the rider falls in the course, but before the boat is in the timing course.
 - d. This 10.02 A rider may jump the water at an end gate provided he is between the buoy's.
 - e. In all events, if a portage pass is made, rule 7.09 If a skier objects not to enter the trial course, he may do so without penalty by throwing the handle in the air or the referee person may release the skier before he enters the trial course.
 - f. This 13 exception: At the option of the sponsoring club, the skier may be allowed to start on a 10.25 meter line at below minimum speed. When the maximum speed is reached, if the skier makes a perfect pass, he receives credit for both the long line and the short line pass. If the pass is missed, he will receive credit for hours or if it were the long line pass.
 - g. It was stated earlier in his year that 3 weeks were necessary for an EP rating in jumping. After going to the technical committee and back to the AWSA board this rule was defunct and will remain in effect.

 2. Reports will be sent for drivers this summer. If you want credit for the tournament you must fill out a performance for every tournament and submit it to the chief driver of the tournament. Selection forms have been sent to 1980 tournament sponsors. If you have not received one or did not send a tournament last year contact AWSA Headquarters. I can not get them for you this year. Sorry! These selections are different this year so please read them carefully. You will note that part of it should be sent to AWSA and part to your E-AT. Please follow these instructions:
 1. Two women division has finally been changed, effectively, women I Age 17-27 Age 28-39 Women II Age 40 & over
 2. Women Age 40 & over
 3. Judges for these new divisions and all others will be put shortly. (Let's AWSA for a new rating card if you are interested in the changes. Hertha has offered AWSA a 20% discount on their rating card. A discount card can be obtained by writing to AWSA Headquarters or will be mailed to all AWSA members upon removal of membership. The 1981 World Tournament will be held in London, England this September. Any interested parties that would like to join the tour for this country contact: Carol Lowe

 4. Chief Judges - If you are a chief judge of a tournament make a copy of all the reports you want in an judges' records and drivers. Keep in your personal files for future reference. Send reports via return mailing mail so you know if they make it to Headquarters. This should solve the problem of knowing or not whether the paperwork is getting to AWSA.
 5. Judges, Don Drivers and Secretaries - You know that you are up for renewal every two (2) years usually in December. When you are due contact AWSA as early as September and ask them to send you a copy of your file. If it is complete, fine. If not, contact the chief judge of the tournament in which you are seeking papers and ask him:
 1. Did you send her reports in AWSA and does he have yours?
 2. Could he send a copy or take out a new questionnaire report and send it to AWSA and yourself so you don't lose your present rating.
 6. Contact your association so he is also aware of the process and can send for checks on it for you.

9. There are several people each year that get turned away from tournaments because they can't have the proper rating requirements. It seems that the rating requirements for Wisconsin tournaments are too high. Since we no longer have a Novice Tournament skiers usually have to get their ratings at an out of state tourney or don't ski. Why not lower our ratings to:
 Men I & Men II expert slalom & jump, 1st class tricks
 All others: no rating or 3rd class
 This would allow everyone the chance to ski and obtain higher ratings along the way. Granted the amount of entries might over power you so put a limit on the entries. Example: 125 or 130 skiers for a 3 event the day tournament tourney. If you don't like this idea come up with a site for a Novice Tournament early in the season or another suggestion to give everyone the chance to compete in our Wisconsin tournaments.
