# TRICKS

## REVERSE TOE BACK

BY MIKE BAUMAN

There are several ways to learn this trick. I will talk about what worked best for me.

First make sure that you are using a high quality trick release and a high quality release person. Without these two you can say bye to your knees. Your starting position should be back straight, head up looking straight ahead, ski knee bent, trick leg extended. Start by practicing a solid pull toward the boat. Once you have mastered this, it's time to get serious. On your first attempts have your release person be prepared to release you as soon as you make your turn. The first bunch of attempts should only be to get the feel of the pull and turn. OK.. READY?

1. Get into position as mentioned above.
2. Make three strong pulls into your knee.
3. On the third pull, make your turn thinking about leading with your eyes and shoulders followed by your toes. If your ski is not coming around which it most likely won't, don't get discouraged as it will come with time.
4. Once you have mastered this you will more than likely find that you are falling forward, to cure this problem when you get to the back position bend your ski knee so that you are almost in a sitting position. This will move your weight back so you are centered on the ski. Everytime you do this trick, try to hold that back position longer. work hard at this one. It will open doors to tricks you thought only Corey could do. This is only a 100 point trick but immediately you will move into the Toe Back to Back which is worth 250 points. Now is the time to start practicing your pulls so your leg is strong. Set up a pulley system and attach your trick handle. Start out with five pounds and work up from there. Happy Trickin!

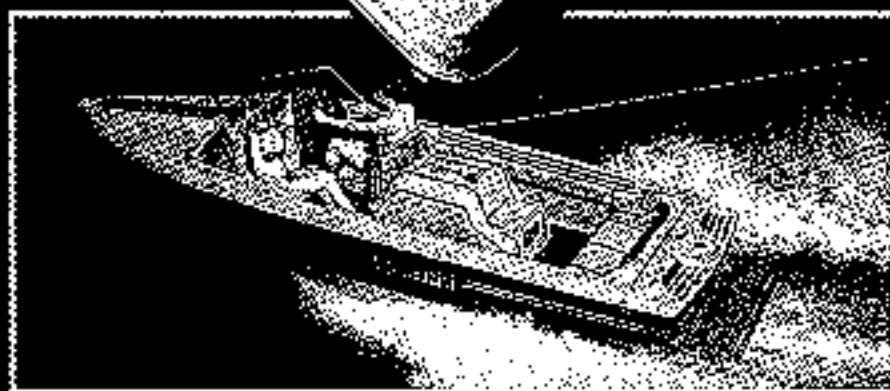
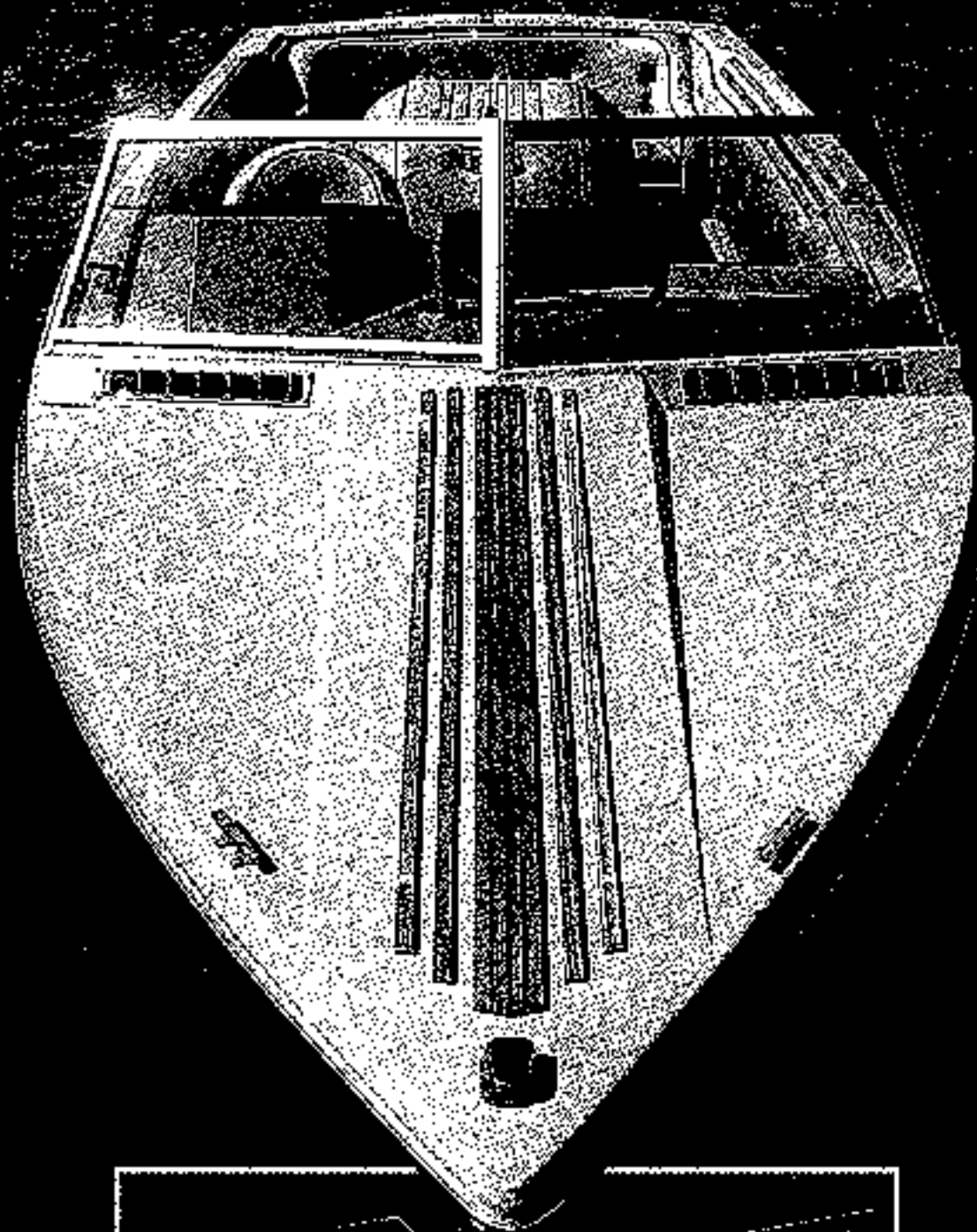

## 3-EVENT

### TIDBITS

Jumpers—9.04—remember if you cut between the ramp and the boat or hit the side arm you will probably be disqualified from further jumps in that round. The emphasis is placed on "definite" and is a judgement decision. We should be hard on this rule because it is a safety rule.

Sleomers—10.9—take another look at the slow speed, perfect pass option. This year at Regionals and Nationals, it was scored as follows: a perfect pass at 30, good time; followed by 6 at 32, slow time. Skier elected to take the option. Skier had 6 at 34, slow time and the option was again taken. This time the skier had a good time but only 3 at 36. The score...the buoys at 30 plus 3.

Trickers—11.17d—remember that a reverse trick must follow the original trick in the same pass. The "exception" is some form of a back, front, 5 or 7. Then that trick may be separated by no more than some form of a 180° turn so that you are able to do the reverse back, front, 5 or 7 (check rule book as to which ones are acceptable.)

11.17a—A trick is that which occurs between 2 hesitations. If you do not stop, there has been no hesitation and a B, F, R, R becomes a b, OB, F and you have lost 20 points. The more difficult the trick the more you loose!

# BAREFOOTING

## The Tumble Turn

Perhaps the most important element to associate with the tumble turn is flow. Once the turn is initiated it should not be stopped. If stopped it should be forgotten and simply tried over. Below are the main points that I stress when teaching the tumble turn.

Wear a full wetsuit. Pants alone will be torn off when dragging face forward and a jacket will be pulled up while sliding headfirst.

Instruct the boat driver to accelerate at a moderate rate to approximately 25 mph. Hold the handle with both hands overhand grip. Begin on your stomach with head down as the boat takes off. When a bit of speed is gained you may lift up the head and pull the arms in under your chest. This will result in you being supported by your elbows and stomach. (Elbows should be close in to ribs and hands at shoulder level)

Remain in this position behind the boat until you are completely ready to begin your spin. This position may be maintained, but the rest of the turn must be continuous. When you are ready to complete the turn, roll to your right side and onto your back, keeping your arms slightly bent and allowing your hands to go no farther out than the top of your head (right side). Pull with one strong quick motion the handle to your left hip and bring knees up. **DO NOT STOP WITH ARMS EXTENDED BEFORE THIS PULL !!!** This pull will spin your body so that your feet are forward. You are still at 25 mph, do not stand up. At this point your driver must increase speed to your normal barefoot rate. This should be done quickly, but not so quickly as to cause the skier to be pulled over forward. As the boat increases speed plant your feet more firmly and gradually stand up.

\*\*\*NOTE: You may reverse all directions and pull from left to right hip. Try each and decide which feels most comfortable for you.
