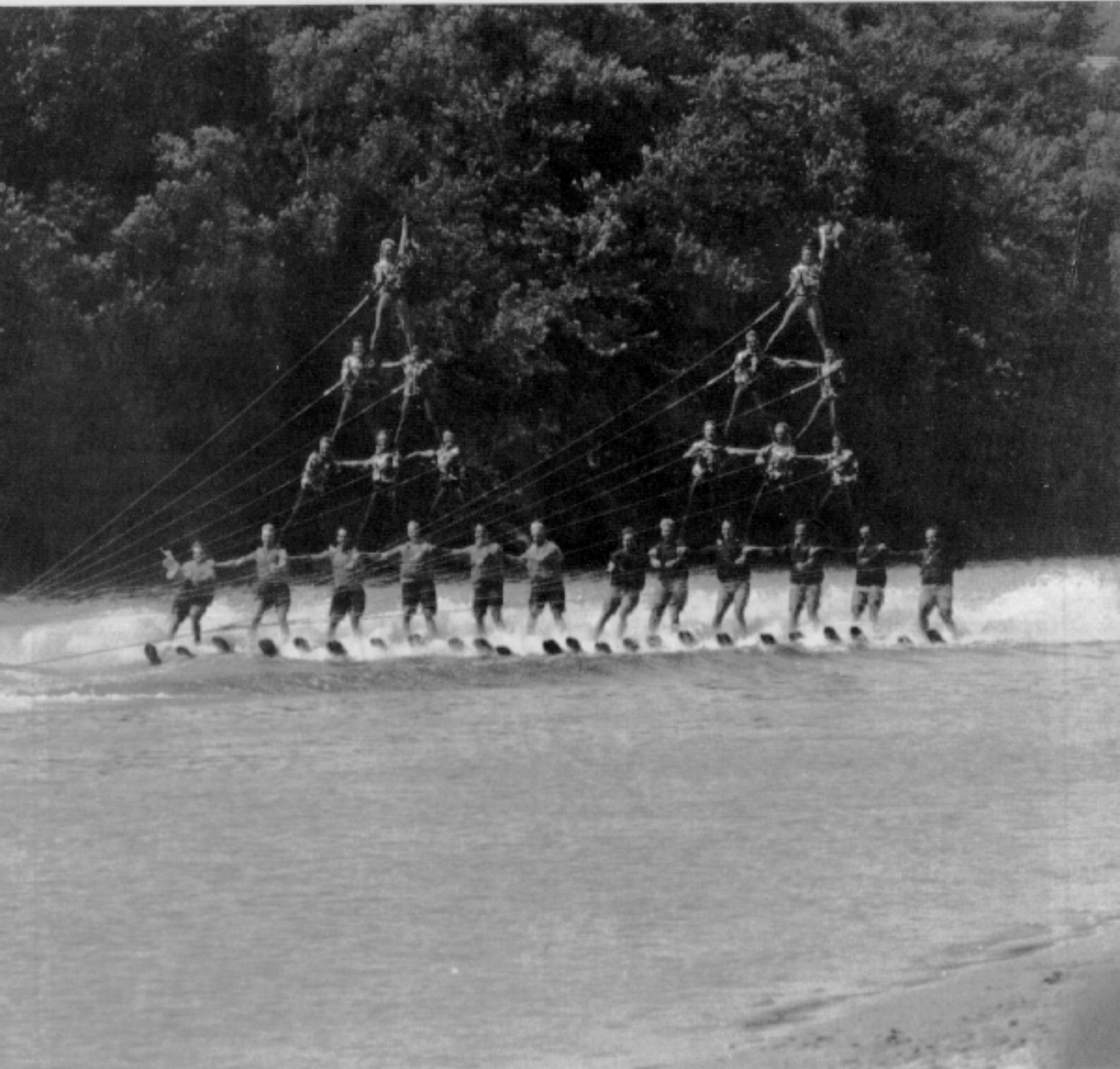

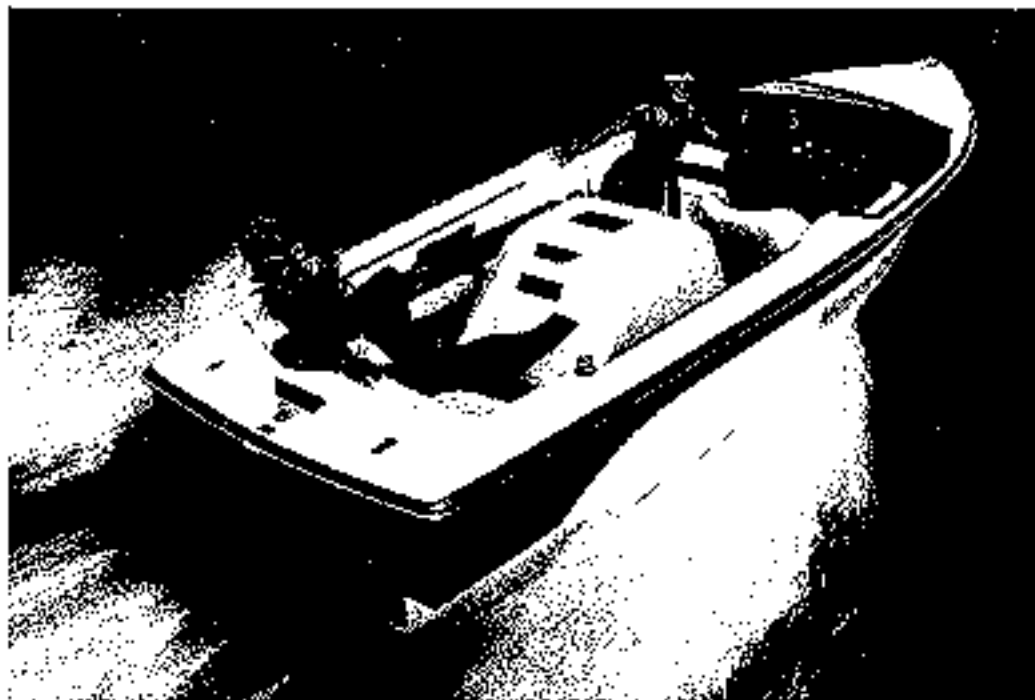

BAREFOOTING

"FOOTEN"

Badgerland Show Club hosted the 1988 Wisconsin State Barefoot tournament on July 9th and 10th on Neosho Pond. 46 competitors from Wisconsin, Minnesota, Illinois, Michigan and even as far as Georgia converged and found glass-like calm water at a beautiful sight. 5 women and 41 men competed in Wakes, Tricks and Jumping with many achieving the required ratings for national competition. Badgerland plans to host the 1989 tournament and hopes to have an even larger turnout.

In Houston, Texas on August 25 - 28, a record 165 Footers gathered at the man-made Lake Terramare for the 1988 National Barefoot Championships. At least 16 pending national records in Wake, Slalom and Tricks, and 4 Jumping records were made possible by the perfect sight and efficiently run tournament. Six pending World Records were set in the 'Open' Division.
